Some non-commercial synchronization licensing can be obtained using our online eSynch tool, at <http://www.songfile.com/esynch>. eSynch can be used to license songs to combine with video images or videos, such as wedding, corporate, or personal website videos, background music on websites, or in a film that will be shown at film festivals.

However, if you are then looking to distribute this film, you will need full synchronization licensing, which our agency does not issue. You will need to contact the publisher(s) of the composition directly in order to inquire about the licensing your project will require.

Additionally, are you looking to use the master recording of the composition(s) you are interested in? You will then need to contact the owner of the master recording itself (most often, this is the record label that

had released the recording(s) in the first place) in order to inquire about obtaining master use rights, in addition to the synchronization licensing you will need. Our agency does not issue master use rights or permissions, either.
